Portoviejo Earthquake Update

This has been an incredibly busy but productive summer! In June and July, Vicky, Sarah, and I were blessed to take a trip back to Portoviejo, Ecuador, Vicky's hometown. We saw some of the devastation from the two earthquakes that occurred only a few days apart in April. Both of these earthquakes were above seven on the Rector scale!

Portoviejo was built on a diverted riverbed, making the ground in the middle of town very unstable. Thus, most of the buildings in the town center either came down or will need to be demolished because they are simply unsafe. There is a complete section of the town center sealed off where no one is allowed inside except for the crews razing the buildings to the ground. All of the buildings inside this corridor are scheduled for demolition. Many other buildings outside this circle are also now vacant, waiting to be leveled. Now, there are policemen guarding the streets to these buildings to keep everyone out. Through-



out the city there are vacant lots where buildings have already been removed. In some places there are small memorials to those who lost their lives. I'm told that over 800 people lost their lives in Portoviejo alone!





Outside the city center, there is an airport that has not been used as such for several years. Instead, it has served as a meeting place for people who wanted to walk or play music and dance. It is now a tent city for some of the many, many people who have no other place to live. They need our prayers!

The church building, we have invested in this past year suffered only minor damage! Only some ceiling tiles and framing for the

ceiling were affected. So much has taken place since we began to invest in the renovation of the building and ministry of the Light of Life church. Vicky's parents have pastored this church for many years without seeing much growth. I felt this lack of growth was largely due to their facility. The church had no place for children's ministry and there was little involvement in the church on the part of the younger generation. Before making



the investment in the building, I had some serious conversations with Vicky's siblings, their spouses, and Vicky's parents. Her parents were very open to making some changes in the ministry, adding the second floor to the building, and providing a place for children's ministry and the CTC program that also operates in the church.



Vicky's older brother, Antonio, and his wife, Marjorie, are CTC students. God is raising them up to pastor the church! With our encouragement, they have made some changes to the format of the ministry in their Saturday evening service. This has brought about growth from what was basically a family ministry of a dozen adults and eight children to their recent attendance of **40 adults** and **15 children on Saturday evening** and **40 adults and 60 children on Sunday morning.** Even some of the older

teens in the family are taking responsibility to teach the younger children. Vicky's father continues to preach on Sunday mornings.

In addition to this, Vicky's younger brother, Christian, and his wife, Lissete, began a **children's ministry** in **Crucita**, a poor area on

to Crucita and pioneer a church. The home has a large covered area at the entrance to the house that could provide a place for the future church to meet. There presently is no evangelical church ministry in Crucita. Missionary Ventures is providing some funding to help us repair damage and make the home safe.

Christian & Lissete are asking for ITM's support to help them make this move. Lissete attends university in Portoviejo five days a week while Vicky's mother watches Asaph, their 14-month old son. ITM has committed \$400 per month to stand with them. Christian will pioneer the ministry and together they will go through the CTC program so he can be credentialed. God is an awesome God! We need your help! I'm looking for 12 families or individuals to sponsor this family for one month each. That is only a \$400 offering that will have a major impact on this community. In addition, we need another 12 of you to sponsor the children's ministry that is also running \$400 per month. Please consider sponsoring a month! We are believing God to win Crucita to Christ—through its children.
